

## Portland Rose Festival Dragon Boat Race June 8-9, 2024 Tom McCall Waterfront Park

#### The Legacy, the Inheritance, and the Cultural Significance

Springtime in Portland ushers in a flurry of activity as the city gears up for the annual Rose Festival Celebration, a vibrant showcase of the City of Roses' beauty and hospitality to the world. Among its myriad attractions is the Portland Rose Festival Dragon Boat Race, a thrilling spectacle that has become a cornerstone of the festivities. What began as a cultural exchange initiative by the Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association (PKSCA) has blossomed into a cherished local tradition, as integral to Portland's springtime as the blooming cherry blossoms gracing the banks of the Willamette River. Crafted with precision and care by skilled artisans in Kaohsiung, Taiwan, the first four traditional dragon boats embarked on a journey across the ocean and arrived on Portland's shores on March 31, 1989. These vessels, more than mere racing boats, carried with them centuries of heritage and tradition, weaving a bond between two cities thousands of miles apart. Now, the sight of the eight second-generation traditional dragon boats gliding across the Willamette has become a riveting scene, drawing visitors and locals alike to witness the boats and teams practice and race.

PKSCA's preference for traditional dragon boats over their more competitive counterparts is rooted in their profound cultural significance. With their fully decorative designs and dragon-shaped prows, traditional dragon boats reflect the rich tapestry of cultural beliefs and myths. They are used in ceremonial events such as the annual Eye Dotting Ceremony, serving as a reminder of ancestral rituals and honoring the spirits of the water and the ancient Chinese mythical creature of the Dragon. In contrast, competitive dragon boats, while sharing the same basic structure, are streamlined for speed and efficiency, they may not carry the same depth of cultural significance as their traditional counterparts. Nonetheless, both types of dragon boats play a vital role in preserving and promoting the heritage of dragon boat racing, ensuring that this ancient tradition continues to thrive in the modern world.

With that in mind, the Portland Rose Festival Dragon Boat Race event relies on dedicated volunteers to ensure its success. Many of our long-standing lead volunteers, who have been the backbone of this event for decades are retiring, leaving crucial roles (Dock Master, Start/Finish Boat, etc) unfilled. We need passionate individuals like you to step up and fill these positions to continue the legacy they've built. Whether you have experience in race coordination, event planning, have unique technical skills, or simply love dragon boating, your contribution will make a huge difference. Additionally, we are actively seeking broader community support, including donations, new avenues of funds, and inviting new teams to join us. Every form of support, whether through volunteering, financial contributions, or team participation, is essential in maintaining the vibrancy of the Portland Rose Festival Dragon Boat Race and ensuring its lasting impact on Portland's cultural scene. 

## Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association's History

The Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association was founded in November 1987. The Portland City Council officially approved Kaohsiung as Portland's Sister City on May 11, 1988. At Mayor Clark's suggestion, the original six member board, comprised of President Dr. Eng Lock Khoo, Gene Chin, Steven Louie, Liu Chi, Judith Reese, and Ted Schneider, was enlarged to fifteen, in order to represent the many facets of the metropolitan community. During the Association's first goodwill mission to Kaohsiung, Commissioners Dick Bogle and Mike Lindberg signed the sister city agreement with Kaohsiung's Mayor Nan Cheng Su on Oct. 11, 1988. To signify the cities mutual tie with the Pacific Ocean, the Association presented a unique gift, a freshly caught, 36 pound Tillamook Bay Chinook salmon.

When the Association selected dragon boat racing as an annual cultural event, Mayor Su promptly donated two boats as a gift to the Association. A third boat was donated by the Republic of China and the fourth was purchased by the Association. All of them arrived at the Port of Portland's Terminal 6 on March 31, 1989 aboard Evergreen's container ship, "Evergoing." On April 10, the elaborately decorated boats made their debut during the "eye-dotting" ceremony which included a special Buddhist ceremony and water display by the Portland Fire Bureau's fireboat. The boats were launched from the lawn of Waterfront Park by means of a 75 foot crane.

The Association's most memorable goodwill mission occurred in October 1990, when 36 Portlanders participated in the Taiwan Area Games in Kaohsiung. Their well-publicized activities caught the attention of then newly-appointed Mayor Wu Den Yih. The following June, Mayor Wu visited Portland during the Rose Festival and officiated at the opening of the 3rd Annual Dragon Boat Races with 60 local and international teams. This year over 65 local and international teams will compete with over 20,000 people in attendance each race day.

During the goodwill mission on October 10, 1991, the 80th anniversary of the Republic of China, the Association gave Kaohsiung a state-of-the-art, US made ambulance in appreciation of their assistance in introducing dragon boat racing to Portland. In honor of the occasion, Kaohsiung donated two additional boats to the Association, one of which hangs on display at the Oregon Convention Center.

In 2007 the association donated over \$80,000 to the city of Kaohsiung for the purchase of a 4 wheel drive emergency rescue vehicle.

In 2008 the Kaohsiung Lions Club donated two new dragon boats to the Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association.

In 2011 the city of Kaohsiung donated two new dragon boats to the Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association.

In 2013 the association purchased two more dragon boats and the city of Kaohsiung donated two additional dragon boats. The association now has a total of eight new dragon boats in their fleet and have since retired the old fleet. 2013 marks the 25th Anniversary of the Portland Dragon Boat Race with the use of our new fleet of dragon boats.

Dr. Eng Lock Khoo was the first president of the Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association. He served for nearly six years. In 1993 John Grimes became president. Mike Chang became the third president in 1994. Mike Chang concluded the Sister School Agreement between Shu-Te High School in Kaohsiung and the David Douglas School District in Portland. A sister university agreement between Portland State University and National Sun-Yat Sen University in Kaohsiung was also concluded. Ted Schneider became president in 1998. He was succeeded in 1999 by Dr. Richard Cole who served for six years. In 2005 Tom Crowder became president and served five years. In 2010 Tom Crowder was succeeded by Mack Lai and in 2015 Mike Bostwick succeeded Mack Lai and served five years. In 2020 Chi-Chao Chen became president.



## Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association's Mission

To promote friendship and understanding between the people of Portland, Oregon and Kaohsiung, Taiwan, R.O.C. The Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association programs include:

#### Awakening the Dragon and Eye Dotting Ceremony

This event officially opens the Dragon Boat season each April. Monks and choir from a local Buddhist temple conduct the formal Buddhist ceremony. Also included in the event is a traditional, and colorful Lion Dance, the formal dotting of the eyes of the Dragon Boats by local dignitaries, and a parade of dragon boats around the Portland Fire Boat.

#### The Annual Dragon Boat Race

This two-day event takes place Saturday and Sunday on Rose Festival Parade weekend. Over 2000 team members and an estimated 40,000 viewers are involved in the largest Dragon Boat race in the continental USA. Over 95 teams compete in 50 heats each day. The event is free and a great example of a Chinese sport that began over 2400 years ago.

## Participation in the Portland Rose Festival Starlight Parade

Each year since 1989, PKSCA has been in the parade paddling a lighted dragon boat through the Willamette River to victory.

## Participation in the Portland Rose Festival Grand Floral Parade

Each year since 1989, the PKSCA Parade unit has included: A beautiful float, music and dance group from Shu-Te High School in Kaohsiung, and a VIP convertible carrying the Kaohsiung Mayor or his designated delegation leader.

## The Host Family Program for Shu-Te High School from Kaohsiung

Host families throughout the Portland area provide an American home experience for two lovely and talented musicians and dancers who stay for one week. Many families stay in contact with their students for many years and have visited with them in Taiwan and here. This is a wonderful first hand cultural experience for both the hosts and the students.

## The Annual official city-to-city Goodwill Delegation Exchange

Each year an official City Delegation from Portland and from Kaohsiung visit for several days. The delegates are made up of City Officials, Civic Leaders, and members of the Sister City Association Board. These visits provide first-hand contact among civic and government leaders and increase understanding of each other's city.

#### **Sponsored Portland Band Performances in Taiwan**

Since 1995, we have sent four bands to Taiwan. In October 1995, the David Douglas High School Jazz Ensemble gave many concerts during the opening week of The Taiwan Area Games in Kaohsiung. In Nov. 1996, over 100 members of the David Douglas High School Marching Band and Tams Dance Team performed in the Taiwan International Band Festival in Taipei. In February 2004, an all-star group of 20 high school musicians and 6 dancers performed in the Lantern Parade and the Chinese New Year celebration in Kaohsiung. In February of 2005 and 2006, a 20 member Mount Hood Community College Jazz Band performed in the Kaohsiung's celebration of the Chinese New Year. These student performers are excellent ambassadors for Portland and the USA.

#### Sister School/University Programs

In June 1994, David Douglas School District and Shu-Te Girls' High School entered a Sister School agreement. This program involves hosting student performers and visiting teachers, and supporting performing groups. In 1998, a Sister University relationship was established between Portland State University and National Sun Yat-Sen University in Kaohsiung. Students from Kaohsiung have attended PSU, and professional communication continues between the Universities.

#### **Outreach and Support Programs**

PKSCA provides support to worthy programs and for disaster relief in Taiwan. In 1991, the PKSCA sent a fully equipped state of the art ambulance as a gift to Kaohsiung as recognition for their gift of 2 Dragon Boats. In 1999, following a devastating earthquake, a fund raising program resulted in a relief donation of over \$44,000. In 2003, \$10,000 was donated to supply face masks during the SARS epidemic. Also, every year PKSCA supports the CCBA Chinese Language School in Portland. These and other in-kind support activities are a high priority for the Portland- Kaohsiung Sister City Association.



## Volunteer & Vendor Appreciation

Without the year-round efforts of individuals, teams, and other groups the Portland Rose Festival Dragon Boat Race would not happen. After the end of last year's race more than 60 volunteers have cleaned, repaired, and painted the boats. Dozens more worked quietly planning the race and getting equipment ready. Additional volunteers have moved the lockers to the North Breakwater Dock, moved the boats out of storage to Willamette Park, and paddled the boats from Willamette Park to North Breakwater Dock. On race days nearly 200 volunteers fill their assignments as dock managers, judges, information staff, marshals, race officials, race result tabulators, runners, and start and finish line crews.

Many organizations and individuals lend their support to this event. The Portland Rose Festival Foundation sanctions the event. The City of Portland Parks and Recreation Bureau and Portland Fire Bureau provide support and services. As part of our storage lease agreement, Zidell Marine Corporation provides a location for Captains' Meetings. Cathy Brunscheon and Jim Kunst furnish the start boat. Fred Harding and his sons spend two days in his boat retrieving flags. Fred Harding also transports finish line equipment to and from the race site. Rich Morgan provides the services of his pontoon boat to assist with our race. Vicki Sekiguchi, Butch Everett, and Rick McLaughlin tow the boats to and from the river and support boat maintenance. With Clyde Travis supervising, A & B Towing & Recovery provides boat towing for the Starlight Parade. Rapid Response Bio Clean donates the portable toilets and trash and recycling services for this year's event. The Little River Café supplies sustenance and much appreciated facilities. The Coast Guard and Coast Guard Auxiliary monitor river traffic on race day in conjunction with the Portland Harbormaster. The Marriott Residence Inn and Marriott Downtown Waterfront offer special rates for dragon boaters and the Kimpton RiverPlace Hotel allows us in their front yard for the weekend.

Months before race weekend numerous individuals are busy. Stephanie and Clyde Travis work together to design and produce this race booklet. Susie Ho and Larry Stewart take wonderful photographs for PKSCA throughout the year. Ken Ma is responsible for managing the dozens of contracts and permits necessary for this event. We would also like to thank Bambuza Hospitality Group for our voluntter T-shirts this year. Lead Volunteers are: Volunteer Coordinator and Marshaling and Escorts, Maxine Davison; Registrar, Angie Chen; Fred Harding, finish line setup; Mike Bostwick and interns, start boat; Johanna and Mary Root, finish line; Clyde Travis, dock supervisor; Mariah Davison, volunteer tent. These individuals are on site all race weekend and spend additional time preparing equipment and training volunteers prior to the event. Tom Crowder, Former Race Director, has continued his invaluable support for our event.

During the time that our boats are not on the water, several volunteers keep our event going strong. Doug Williams has continued his dedication to maintenance tasks, Gale Zimmerman continues to support Doug with paint and life jacket assistance, Megan Kunze and Aaron Bocanegra continue to see to our social media presence and sourcing vendors, and Amy Stevens continues to help with other duties of the Race Committee.

Our event is an all-volunteer operation, and we are always looking for more folks to step up to help us. Please consider joining the team that keeps our event going.

We are extremely grateful for and extend thanks to all the volunteers and support organizations. We also want to thank our sponsors for their support. Finally, as you, the team members and spectators meet the volunteers in action, please take a moment to give them your personal thank you as well.


## The Legend of Dragon Boat Racing

The Dragon Boat Races are the most popular early summer activity in the Orient wherever Chinese cultural influence prevails. It is the most important part of the Twan-Wu Festival, the fifth day of the fifth month on the lunar calendar.

According to legend, during the Warring States period 475-222 B.C., the state of Chu had a high ranking minister of great talent and genius named Chu Yuan. To the west, the state of Chin was determined to seize the state of Chu. For this reason, feigning a desire for friendly diplomatic ties, the state of Chin invited King Huai to Wukuan, to draw up a treaty. King Huai did not heed Chu Yuan's cautionary advice and consequently was kidnapped by Chin soldiers and died in the state of Chin. King Huai's eldest son, King Hsiang, not only failed to consider avenging his father but acted obsequiously toward the state of Chin. In addition, he believed a slander advanced against Chu Yuan and banished him.

On the fifth day of the fifth month of the lunar calendar, Chu Yuan reached the bank of the Mi Luo river. There, the wise, sad hero committed suicide and threw himself into the river. When the people of Chu heard this, they feared the fish in the river would eat Chu Yuan's body. Thronging into boats, they rowed out to the middle of the river and threw great quantities of rice into the water to feed the fish, thus hoping that Chu Yuan's body would be left alone. The search for his body has evolved into present day dragon boat races and the ritual of eating "Tsung Tze," sticky rice cakes wrapped in bamboo leaves.

The Twan-wu Festival also signals the change from spring to summer and can be traced back to the Chou Dynasty as a folk festival. In the distant past, farmers depended solely on the rain to water their crops. On this festival day, farmers prayed for the "Dragon of the Clouds" to send rain. They also prayed for the "Dragon of the Seas" to calm the ocean and rivers

## David Douglas & Shu-Te High School's History

The Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association was instrumental in establishing the first Sister High School relationship between Portland and Taiwan. On June 13, 1994, David Douglas School District and Shu-Te High School entered into a Sister School agreement at a formal signing ceremony. The signing ceremony preceded an hour-long performance of traditional orchestra and dance presented by the Shu-Te student musicians and dancers.

The idea of the sister school relationship started when the Shu-Te High School musicians and dancers performed in Portland on June, 1992. Following a stunning performance of traditional music and dance, Dr. Richard Cole, then Director of Curriculum for David Douglas School District, approached Dr. Khoo, then president of the Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association, about using the David Douglas Performing Arts Center for the following year's performance. Dr. Khoo responded by asking David Douglas to coordinate and arrange for host families for the Shu-Te students. David Douglas has coordinated housing each year since. The students are wonderful representatives of their school and country. Many families continue to host them year after year. The Shu-Te High School students perform for all 5th and 6th grade David Douglas students and sometimes have joint performances with the David Douglas High School Orchestra. They have also visited elementary classrooms. The high school Leadership Class hosts the students in many of their activities and have developed pen-pal correspondence with students in Kaohsiung.

The Sister School relationship has stimulated other activities. David Douglas teachers have spent summers teaching conversational English at Shu-Te High School. In 1995, the 20 member David Douglas Jazz Ensemble went to Kaohsiung and were hosted by Shu-Te High School. They performed at Shu-Te as well as

Individuals vary in length from 5 to 6.3 feet and display a variety of phenotypes. They are easily distinguished from other species in the genus by their well developed upper body and appendages, which they use to propel themselves through the water. Civil Serpents are a social species. Many are domesticated and work in state and local government office settings. In the wild they congregate in the early evening along the Willamette River to engage in flashy displays of athleticism in an attempt to establish dominance on the river. Occasionally they can be found in small or large groups at the local watering hole. Collectively, S. civicus are omnivores with a proclivity for cake.



During the Rose Festival, Pink Phoenix sponsors an annual exhibition race celebrating sisterhood, survivorship and sport. In this race, experienced paddlers, first time paddlers and survivors along for the ride, join together to race on the Willamette in memory of Michele Gorman, our team's first captain. The Gorman Cup is an example of the strength and spirit we, as survivors, give to ourselves, each other and our community. We take pride in our core values as an organization which include commitment, balance, respect, welcoming, growth and celebration.

The "Pinks" are on the river 3 times a week during race season and travel to local, regional and out of state races during the race season. In April 2023, some "Pinks" participated as part of a composite team representing the Pacific Northwest at the International Breast Cancer Paddlers' Commission Regatta in New Zealand, where over 2500 women, all breast cancer survivors, from around the world competed in racing and celebrating survivorship! The team loves an "away game," where bonds are tightened over board games and good conversation.
